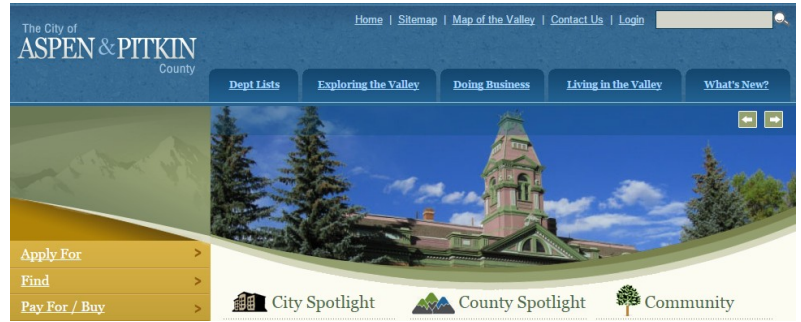


### What is the archived website?

Pitkin County has contracted with the *Internet Archive* to capture, preserve, and access the [former Aspen/Pitkin web site](#) (legacy web site).



### What time frame does the Archive cover?

We captured content residing on the website from October 20, 2014 through February 25, 2015. We launched our current website on March 2, 2015.

### Will the County update the archived website?

No. The archives are “snapshots in time”. The content is historical and is not updated. Please use our current website to access the most up-to-date information.

### How long will I be able to access the archived content?

The Internet Archive has agreed to host the legacy web site for Pitkin County into perpetuity.

### What’s available in the archive and what is not?

The web capture technology (*Archive-It*) only captures static content that the County directly managed. When you click on a link and receive a message that says “Not in Archive”.....



....this means that the content is either:

- part of an online database application or search tool
- requires a user ID and password for access
- hosted by a service provider outside of the County’s domain
- blocked by the website from archival capture (robots.txt)
